Who We Are:

Founded in 2008 and based in Southern California (Orange County), Exodus Cry is a leading global anti-trafficking nonprofit organization, committed to abolishing sex trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation, assisting, and empowering its victims and educating the public about these horrific crimes. We work to abolish trafficking by targeting and uprooting its underlying causes.

What We Do:

Exodus Cry fights to end sex trafficking and all forms of commercial sexual exploitation by exposing this injustice on a mass scale and mobilizing millions of people to call for change. We also work with victims, assist them in finding freedom from exploitation, and empower them to build healthy new lives.

How We Do It:

Exodus Cry leverages the power of film, videos, social content, and the written word to expose trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation on a mass scale. We also advocate for passing laws that will uproot these injustices, and reach out to victims on the streets, in strip clubs, and online, offering them practical resources and guidance on their path to freedom and healing.

Our Accomplishments:

From its inception, Exodus Cry has been a leader in the anti-trafficking movement and has inspired countless people around the world to join the fight. Although our team is relatively small, our impact is global and large, thanks to the ripple effect of our films, campaigns and the millions of people who respond to them.


Our Current Advocacy Efforts:

Exodus Cry is currently advocating for change in three key areas of the sex industry:

- Passing the Equality Model (Abolition Model). This prostitution legislation makes pimping, brothel owning and sex-buying illegal, while decriminalizing the people being sold for sex. Under this model, those who are exploited are offered services and resources instead of a criminal record.
- 2. Protecting children from porn exposure through required ID-based age verification for site visitors on all websites that host porn.
- 3. Raising the minimum age of entry for porn performers from 18 to 21.
